UPM MEETS ALL REQUIREMENTS OF REACH

UPM meets all the set requirements of REACH and welcomes REACH as a positive development in streamlining EU chemical legislation.

UPM has actively worked with CEPI and national associations to make sure that all necessary steps are taken to fulfil the requirements of REACH.

UPM is mainly a 'downstream-user' of chemicals and has taken the necessary steps to make sure that all our chemical suppliers are aware of the REACH requirements.

UPM's main raw materials (e.g. wood, fillers and coating pigments, chemical and mechanical pulp) are not included in REACH according to the current legislation and do not need to be registered. PCC, used as filler in paper production, is included in REACH and it has been registered by the suppliers.

UPM paper, pulp, plywood, timber products or bio composites are not to be considered as 'substances' under REACH. Substances of very high concern are not present in these articles/materials on a concentration level (>0,1 w-%) that would require communication to our customers or to ECHA.

The UPM Biofuels products and by-products and intermediates of chemical pulping have been registered as required in REACH legislation.
